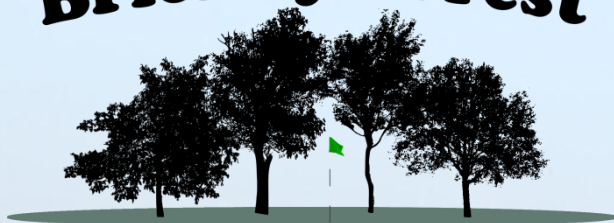

Foreword

The competition book has been written and designed to assist all competitive playing members of Brierley Forest Golf Club.

The sole purpose of the book is to outline the rules of each competition that the club may run.

Although the present committee (at the time of publication or amendments are carried out) have tried to cover all eventualities, there may be ambiguities that have not been foreseen. In this event, the competition secretary and the committee decisions are final.

Please make sure you are familiar with the rules of the competition you are playing.

General Rules

The minimum number of entrants to make a competition is seven.

Any singles competition that has between 14 and 59 entrants will be divided into two divisions if a minimum of seven entrants in each division can be maintained unless otherwise stated in the specific competition details.

Any singles competition that has sixty or more entrants will be divided into three divisions. The divisions will be auto balanced using handicaps unless otherwise stated in the specific competition details.

5 balls are not permitted to enter the competitions and will result in disqualification.

The payouts are calculated using the following rules:

Singles

If there are nine players or less in a specific division then only the winner is awarded a prize in that division. If there are 10 players or greater in a specific division then the winner and runner up is awarded a prize in that division unless otherwise stated in the specific competition details (N.B. this may mean the winner & runner up are awarded

prizes in one division and the other division only the winner is awarded a prize).

Pairs

If there are up to 13 entrants, prizes are awarded to the winner only. If there are between 14 and 59 entrants, the winners & runners up are awarded prizes. If there are 60 or more entrants, prizes are awarded to the winners, the runners up & third place finishers.

Three & Four Person Teams

If there are up to 59 entrants, prizes are awarded to the winner only. If there are 60 or more entrants, the winners & runners up are awarded prizes.

All Knock Out tournaments will award prizes to the winners & runners up.

If 50% of the field in a drawn competition have signed in (accumulatively and irrespective if the competition is played over one or two days) then the competition shall be deemed as valid.

Before any player has teed off in a major competition, the competition secretary or the committees elected people may postpone the competition in the event of inclement weather or if the course is deemed unfit for play.

If a competition has started, the Competition Secretary, or an elected committee member has the authority to postpone or cancel the competition due to inclement weather or if the course is deemed unfit for play using advice from the Management.

The elected committee members are the Secretary, Treasurer & Chairperson.

The competition's entry costs are as follows. This does not include Captains competitions:

Major competitions: £5.00.

Non-major competitions: £4.00

£0.50 of these fees cover the two's competition except in a Texas Scrambles, Match Play or winter midweek 9-hole competitions which will be £2.50.

Winter League will be £2 per card entered.

Prizes

65% of the entry fees will be paid out as Brierley Forest GC Vouchers for non-major competitions. 75% of the entry fees will be paid as Brierley Forest GC Vouchers for major competitions. All trophies presented to winners of the Major competitions will be funded by the committee. The pay out will be divided up as follows:

All prize vouchers will be rounded to the nearest £1.00. Single Medals have a secondary prize of best Gross score if they have not finished in one of the prize positions. This equates to double the entry fee & is taken from the prize pot prior to the division of winnings.

Winners of all non-major competitions will be available to collect from the clubhouse within a few days. Winnings will be kept at the clubhouse for up to four weeks. Following this time, the committee must be contacted to arrange collection.

Two's

All two's competition winnings will be rounded up to the nearest £0.50 & will be available to collect from the clubhouse within a few days.

A hole in one does not qualify for a payout from the two's competition but will be awarded £25.00 Voucher.

The player is responsible for signing into the competition before commencing play and for entering their score into the computer at the end of the round. This is in addition to

signing and posting the scorecard in the competition cards box.

If the computer is not operational or the competition secretary deems that adequate procedures have been followed, they have the right to waver this local competition rule.

Please note that failure to comply with the above two paragraphs will result in disqualification from the club competition but handicap adjustments may still be carried out.

Winners of majors have two chances to collect their award at the club presentations. If they are unable to attend the second presentation after missing the first, then they are permitted to nominate another member to collect the prize on their behalf, in writing to the Secretary. Failure to collect a trophy within these two presentations means forfeiting of the trophy. Following this, the committee must be contacted to arrange the collection of vouchers.

Handicap percentages are taken off the course handicap. This means your Handicap Index is converted using the conversion table into the course handicap. The

playing handicap is then calculated using the following formula.

Course Handicap x Percentage as decimal = Playing Handicap.

For example, $20 \times 0.95 = 17.1$ (Rounded to 17)

Maximum strokes received for all Majors is 28 for Men & 37 for Ladies.

The committee or club must be informed of any tee time cancellations for drawn out Majors the day before the day of play at the latest. Anyone not providing notice will still be charged the competition entry fee. Failure to pay will result in a ban from the next drawn-out competition. The committee will consider extenuating circumstances.

Tied Score ‘Countback’

When a competition result is a tie ‘countback’ will be used to decide the winner. Our handicapping software automatically takes care of this using recommended guidance from the rules of golf. The Handicap and Competition Secretary is unable to change the way the system conducts the countback.

For 18 holes the winner is determined based on the score for the last nine, six, three and finally the 18th hole (s) in

turn. If there is still a tie then the last six, three and final hole (s) of the first 9 holes will be considered in turn. For a round less than 18 holes, the same format of the last 9, 6, 3 holes and final hole played in turn.

Reduced Holes

Whilst it may not happen too often, any competition could be played over reduced holes. For instance, if only nine holes are open due to inclement weather conditions. For these competitions, the maximum shots that can be received will be based on the number of holes open divided by 18.

Completing a scorecard

All scorecards are to be readable and clear to understand. Cards need to be checked by club officials & should be filled out with the correct information as demonstrated below. If cards are not completed by the player to a required standard, then the competition secretary (or other club official) may deem the cards incorrect & disqualification may occur.

Substitutes are permitted providing that the team have not played any of their matches & that one of the original team members remains.

History

The Winter League was proposed in 2023, by member Alan Bite, to encourage play over the winter months. 'The Alan Coombe Trophy was kindly donated by Robert Bullock in memoriam of a long-standing, much loved and missed senior member.

Format

The competition is a midweek, top 10, Singles Stableford.

To be played from the beginning of December through to the end of February off yellow pots and winter mats, with a maximum of five rounds per month, with the best three to count. As per golf rules the same course layout cannot be played twice, i.e., only one round per day can be submitted.

Monthly league table and pay-out for 1st and 2nd with overall winner, runner up and the player with the most 2s awarded prizes at the end of the competition.

£2 to enter each round, players that enter more than five cards will not receive a refund. Payment and signing in must be at the start of the round.

This competition is not divisional.

Handicap or divisions do not apply over 10 holes, evidence instead in general play will be used for handicap review in March the following year.

When temporary or 'target greens' (without a hole) are in play there is a large and small marked circular line. The ball must not be on the line but inside it. If the ball lands inside the large circle this is the green and add on plus one, where the ball lands in the small circle this is in the 'hole'.

Scorecards have been produced, one card for two players, the box in the top corner is for each round to be recorded and both players must sign as a player and marker.

The Stroke Index has been generated by Handicap Master.

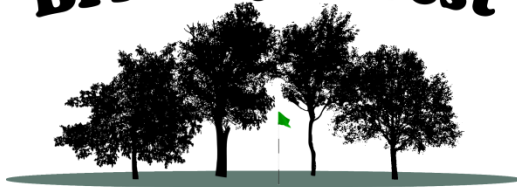
